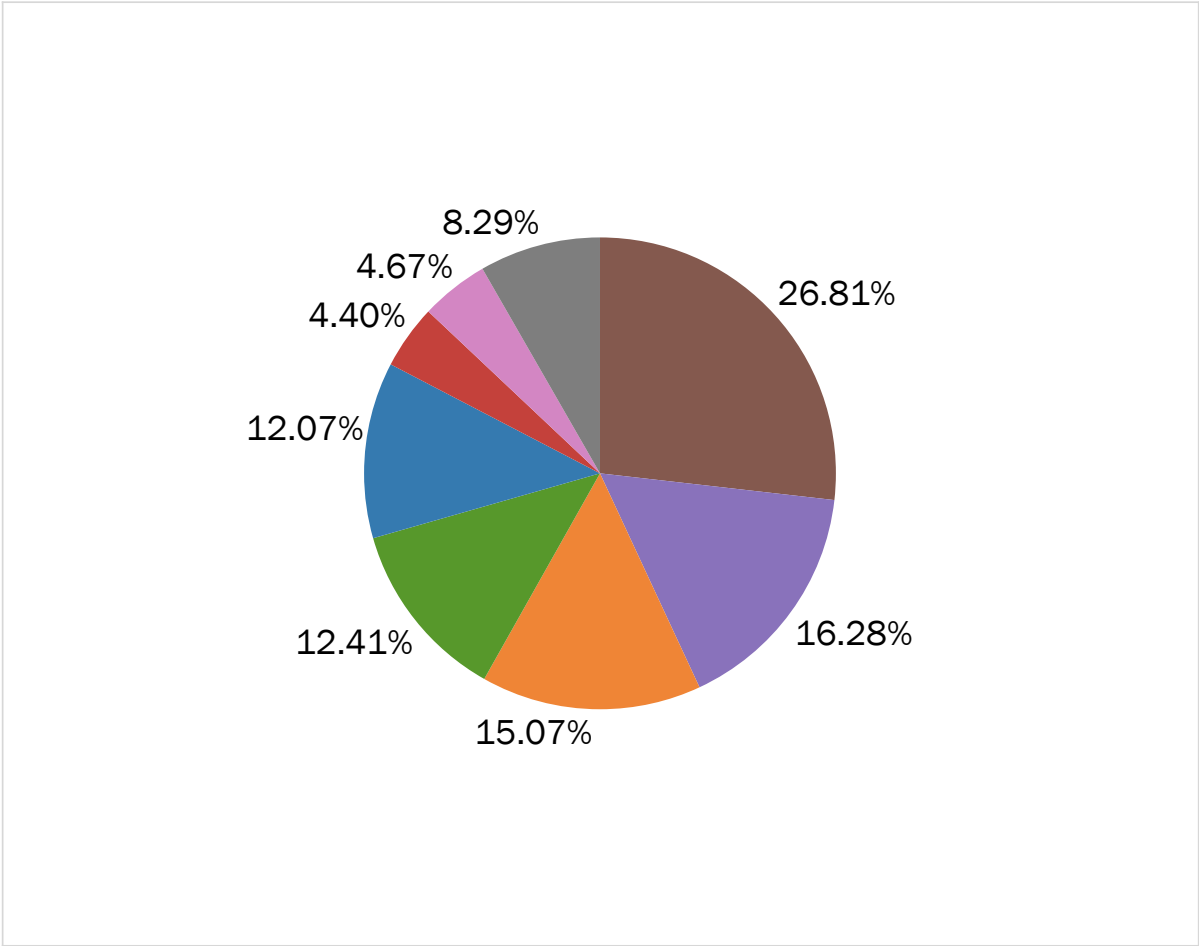

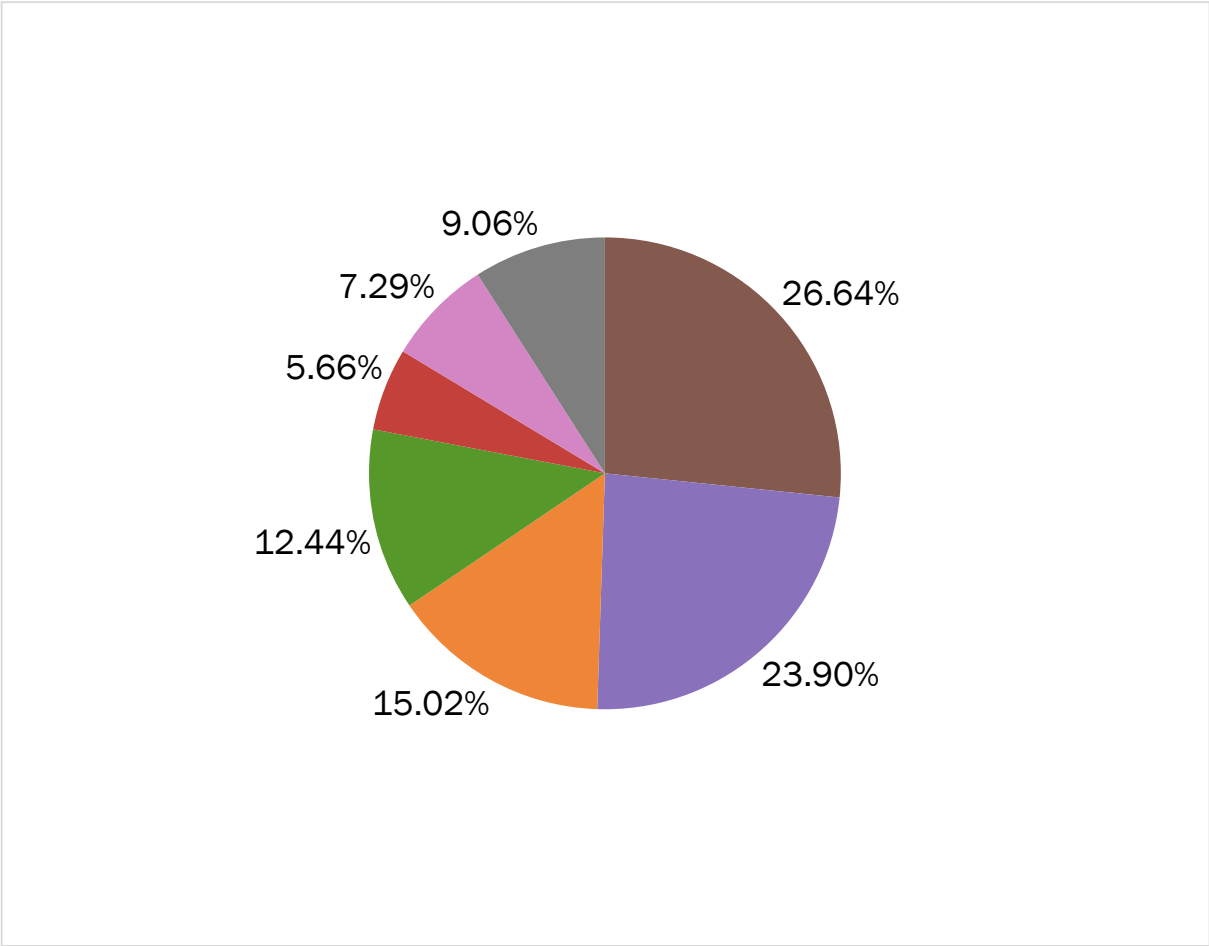

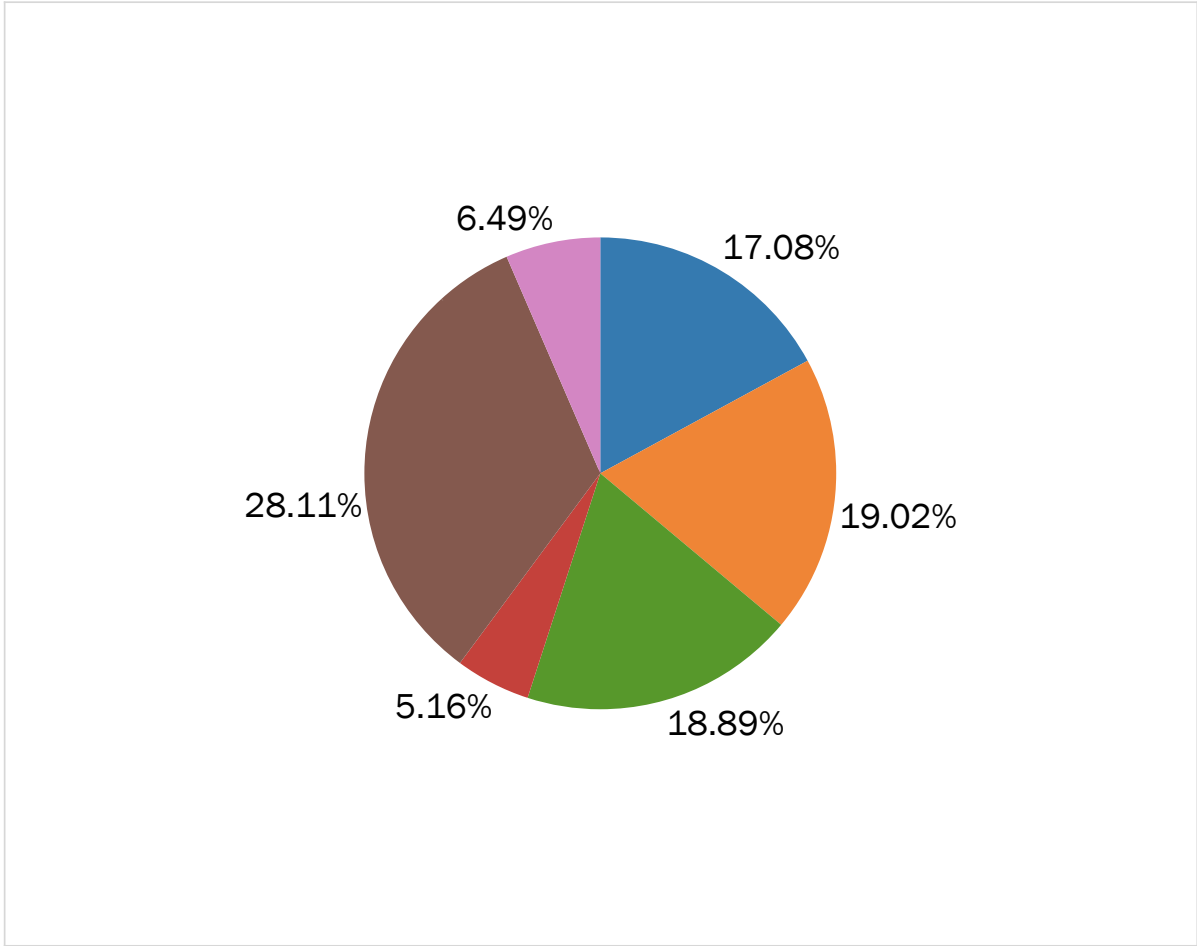

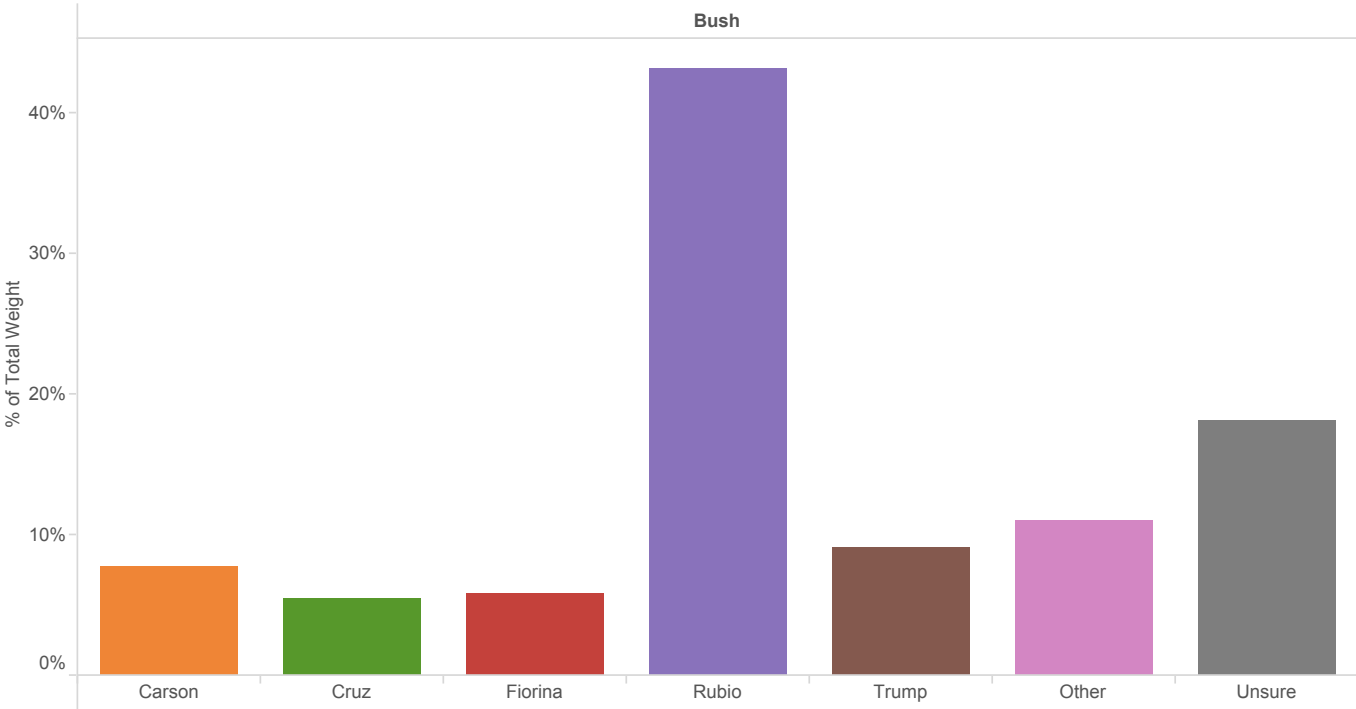

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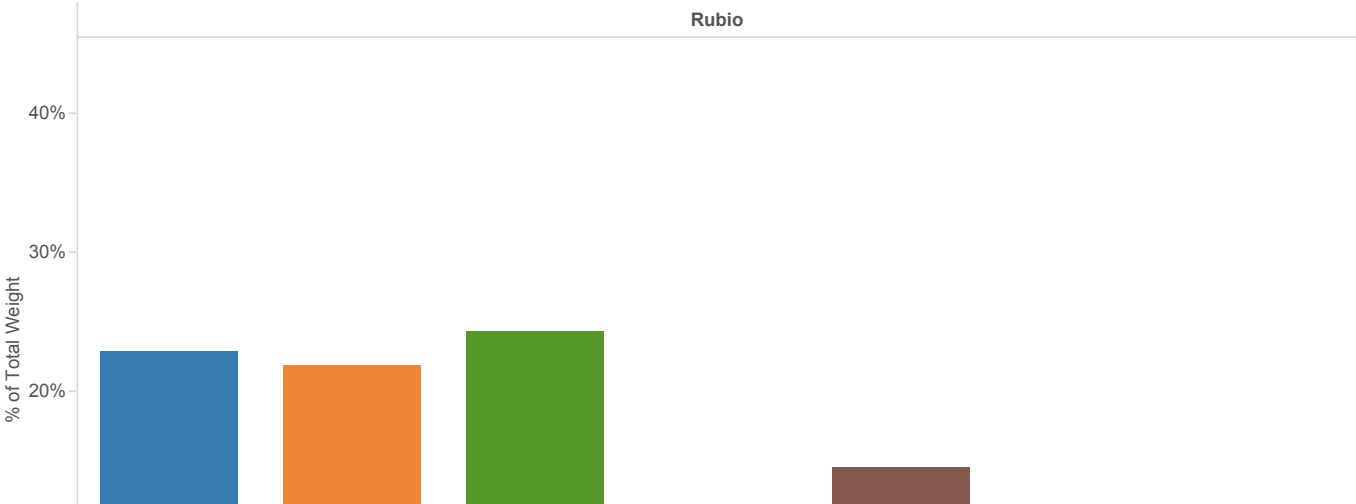
Q4A - Initial Bush Supporters Choices on Alternate Ballot

Q4B - Initial Rubio Supporters on Alternate Ballot

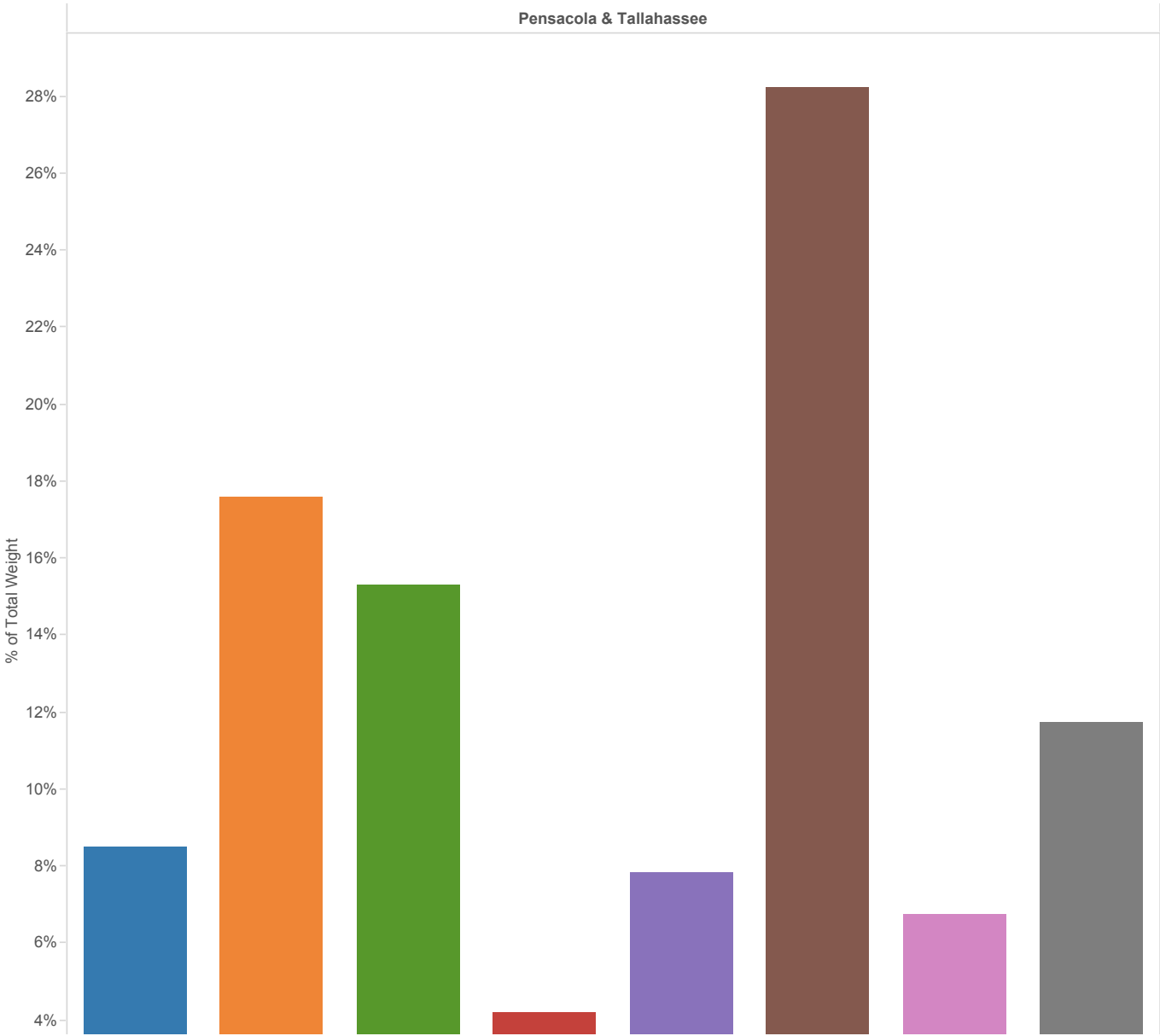

Initial Ballot Test - Pensacola + Tallahassee Markets



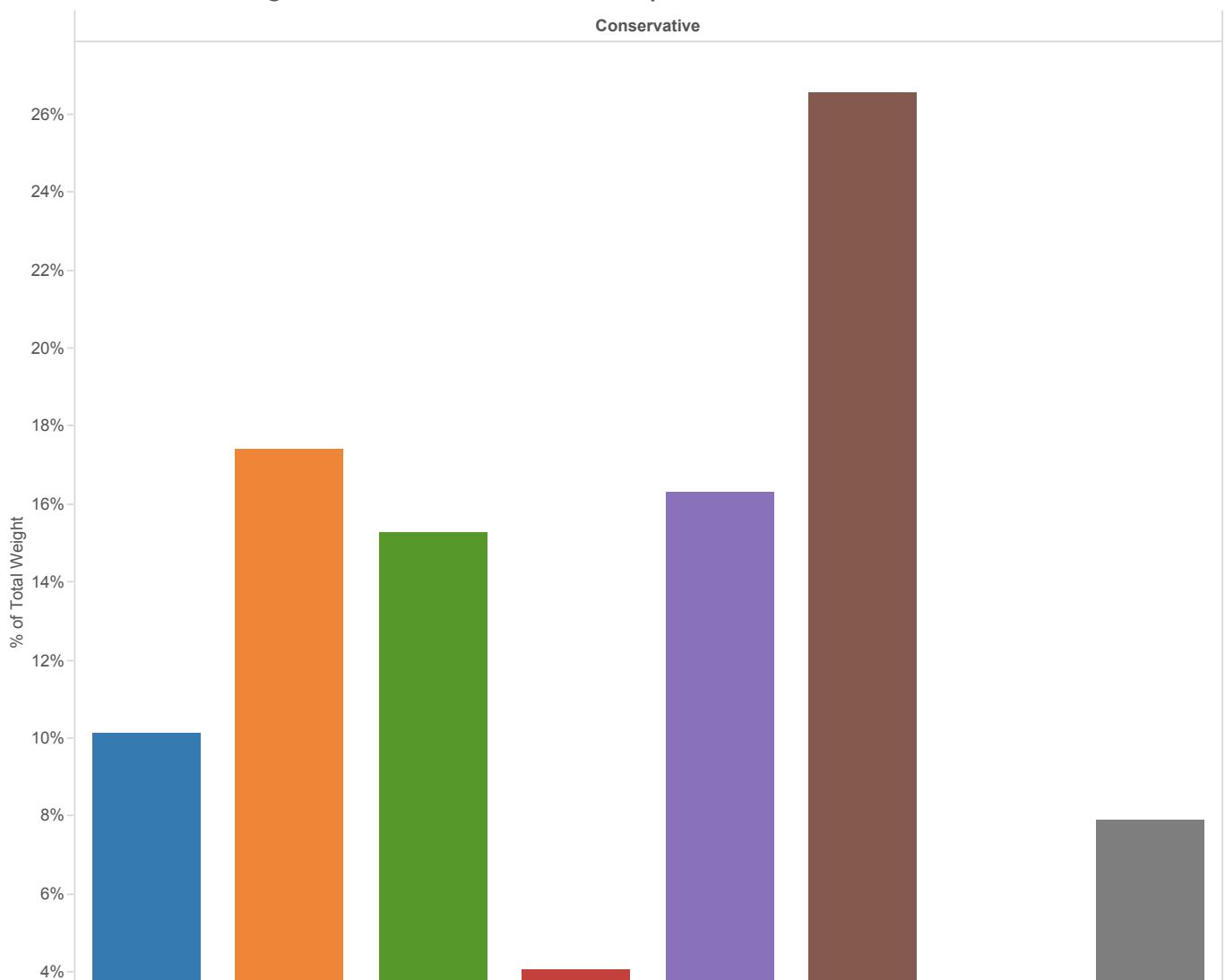
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- Trump's paths to victory or defeat are based on how one question is answered - do conservative primary voters coalesce around 1 candidate by March 15?

- Carson, Cruz and Rubio are deadlocked for 2nd place against Trump now - if anyone wins that fight, Trump's in trouble. If none of them win, he can win going away
